Artwork Guidelines

Accepted File Formats

- Print-Ready PDF (Preferred)
 - Be sure to include bleeds and crop marks.
- InDesign, Illustrator, Photoshop, Quark, Microsoft Office, Microsoft Publisher

Artwork Guidelines

Layout

Single pages (not spreads), in numerical order (1,2,3...) work best

Bleed

1/8" bleed is required when your project has art elements that extend to the edge of the trim and for Wide Format Cutting of letters and graphics.

Color

Use the CMYK color mode for color images.
Use Pantone colors whenever a color match is important.

Images

Use **Vector images (.ai and .pdf)** whenever possible. They are always sharp, no matter the size.

Resolution

Offset and Digital Printing—300 dpi=High Quality, 150-299 dpi=Good Quality, 1-149 dpi=Low Quality

Wide Format Printing—151-300 dpi for a printed item being viewed up close, 150 dpi (or less) for a printed item being viewed from a distance (Several feet)

Safe Zone

All elements (text, images, logos, etc.) must be kept at least 1/8" (.125") away from the trim edge.

Proofs

Soft Proof

Soft proofs (PDF) are fine most of the time. They are great for checking content but will not always accurately show color or other problems such as resolution.

Hard Proof

For color critical projects, we offer a hard proof (ink on paper). This is the best way to be sure that your expectations on the final product are met.
